Our text read בטי (and not בטי is a Jewish name -

כדאמר בקידושין (דף ע,ב) בטי ברמות רוחיה לא קביל גיטא דחירותא –

As the מסכת קידושין relates in מסכת that בשי because of his arrogant spirit would not accept a document of emancipation, תוספות explains -

שהיה עבד והיה מחזיק עצמו כישראל:

For עבד כנעני was an עבד כנעני but he held himself as a complete Jew, therefore he refused to accept a שטר שהרור because in his mind he was already a (free) Jew (and had no need for a שטר שהרור).

SUMMARY

נטי is a Jewish name, while בטאי is from the שמות מובהקים.

THINKING IT OVER

Do the names בטאי sound different (besides being spelled different), or are they only spelled different, but sound similar?

¹ בטי would tell everyone that he was born Jewish (he would [try to] hide the fact that he was a freed slave). Therefore שמות מובהקים could not and would not maintain himself as a ישראל if his name was from the שמות מובהקים of the מהר"ץ היות, but rather בטי must have been an accepted Jewish name. See
