## She teaches herself a leniency

## **OVERVIEW**

The גמרא explained the reason why בי"ד would not administer an oath to an אלמנה (as opposed to a מורה היתר is אלמנה to take money from the or for her [paid up] כתובה, for she feels she is working so hard for them she deserves something extra. תוספות discusses what בי"ד does to insure that she is truthful.

-ולכך נמנעו מלהשביעה שעונש שבועה מרובה אלא בהדרה אלא בהדרה שעונש שבועה ולכך אלי מלהשביעה שעונש שבועה מרובה אלא בהדרה שמונש אלי א And therefore בי"ד was unwilling to administer an oath to her, because the punishment for a false oath is severe; rather they imposed that she take a vow, which is not that severe if it is transgressed -

והשתא בזמן הזה תקנו לקבל חרם<sup>3</sup> במקום שבועה שלא יהא העונש גדול כל כך: And nowadays in this time they instituted a הרם ban instead of a שבועה, so the punishment for transgressing the הרם will not be so severe.

## **SUMMARY**

The חכמים did not want to administer an oath to an אלמנה because since she is מורה, she may be severely punished; instead they made her take a vow. Nowadays we proclaim a חרם if she is lying.

## THINKING IT OVER

Why cannot we say<sup>4</sup> that נמנעו מלהשביעה, because since she is מורה היתר, the שבועה is of no avail, for she will swear falsely since she is מורה היתר?! [Alternately; if she is מורה היתר, what purpose is there in her making a מורה היתר $^5$
