Overview

דבא taught that if a כלי הרס was perforated to a degree that a small root can protrude from this hole, the plants in this כלי הרס are considered attached to the ground, and even if they come into contact with water or other liquids they are still not מוכשר מוכשר Our מוכשר claims that this גמרא refutes a פרש"י elsewhere.

שפירש דספינה של חרס דכיון שהיא של עפר חשובה כנקובה³ ועת לקצר: Where he explained regarding a ship made from earthenware, that since it was made from earth it is considered as if it is perforated; but now is the time to be brief.

Summary

A כלי חרס requires a hole in order to be considered attached to the ground.

Thinking it over

Seemingly תוספות כould have refuted רש"י from the previous rulings (especially when ruled that רבא ruled that ניקב ככונס משקה וכו' ועדיין הוא כלי להכשיר זרעים), which indicate that it is not considered נקוב even though it is a כלי הרס wait until רבא said that תוספות אוספות מלהכשיר בו זרעים ?!
